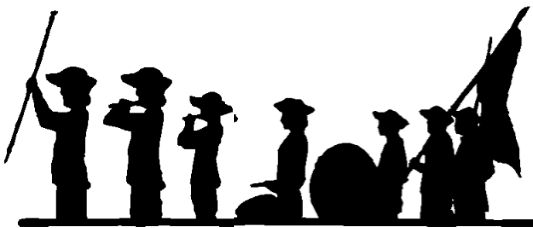

About the Marquis of Granby

The Marquis of Granby is a historic recreation of a military unit of the 18th century, and has maintained historic accuracy with few exceptions. Founded in 1969 in Granby, Connecticut, the Marquis is among the numerous ancient corps registered with the Company of Fifers and Drummers, and one of a few corps nationwide with an all youth membership.

The Marquis has roots derived from a pre-revolutionary colonial militia sponsored by a titled Englishman, John Manners. Manners was the honorary head of a militia in the colonies before the Revolution. The 18th Militia was located in the area of Connecticut we now know as Granby, with Joseph Forward as Captain of one of the companies in the militia. The official name for our present corps is the Connecticut 18th Militia, Captain Joseph Forward's Company, The Marquis of Granby's Regiment.

The Corps has traveled extensively throughout the eastern United States, as well as to England, Switzerland, Canada, and Scotland. We have won numerous awards throughout the years, including Best Ancients, Best Musical Unit and Best Marching Unit.
